Dear Fellow Solid Waste Management Board of Directors May 29th, 2018

On March 8th, this board received a 2017 Waste Composition Report which revealed that Cortes Island had the highest organics component in the waste stream of any other community in the region. I have since been thinking on this and speaking with community members and included the article to the right in my most recent Regional Director newsletter.

If this waste audit is reflective of reality (which I still struggle to believe, but must be) then we truly need to look at measures to remove organics from the Cortes waste stream. There may be creative options for local composting of the material and the SRD may be able to expand its curb-side collection program to include organics pick-up.

I would be most grateful if staff could take a further look at this situation and return to the board with a report including options for Cortes organics diversion. In speaking with our CAO, I understand that staff would like to undertake this work and would appreciate the board's support to do so. To that end, I would respectfully request that the board pass the following resolution.


