Proposed Budget Feedback and Revisions

Feedback

- 1. Error in 2028 operating contracts
- 2. Concerns about low transfers to reserves

Revisions

- 1. Corrected 2028 operating budget
- 2. Reduced support services expense, reallocated to reserves



Prior Year Surplus Operating Budget Changes (Proposed to Recommended)

- Estimated 2023 surplus: ~\$3,000,000
- Major drivers behind surplus:
 - Higher tipping fee revenue and scrap metal prices
 - Lower-than-budgeted operating contract and maintenance costs
 - Delayed commissioning and lower chemical costs
 - Savings on procurement for organic bins
- Operating carry-forward projects included in surplus



Prior Year Surplus Capital Budget Changes (Proposed to Recommended)

- Total 2024 capital projects: \$2,221,389
- No changes from proposed budget (only carry-forwards from 2023)

Asset Management Plan (AMP) and Reserves

- AMP developed in 2019, needs updating due to new infrastructure
- 2024 contribution to capital works reserves good for 2024 AMP estimate
- Future years are underfunded
- Anticipated update to AMP will inform future financial plans



Solid Waste Management Plan

- Determining revenue based on SWMP conclusions and fiscal policies
- Financial strategy for SWMP renewal:
 - 1. Review and development of financial policies
 - 2. Evaluation of financial implications of proposed initiatives
 - 3. Development of sustainable long-term financial plan
 - 4. Optimization of fee structures
 - 5. Identification of financial risks and mitigation strategies



Recommended Financial Plan Recommendation Options

Option 1: Approve 2024-2028 CSWM Recommended Financial Plan as presented

• Further analysis and policy development for future adjustments

Option 2: Approve plan with additional updates

• Gradual taxation and reserve contribution increases (as noted in staff report)
